Ken Cobb gave much joy to many people with his music. He and his family wanted to pass along his enthusiasm and make learning a stringed instrument possible for children who would ordinarily not be able to afford lessons. Now in its seventh year of assisting students, the Ken Cobb scholarship allows students to borrow an instrument, either a violin, viola or a cello, for the nominal fee of \$50 for the year.

Learning a musical instrument takes a lot of work, persistent dedication and a great commitment from the whole family. Any new student interested in the scholarship would take 2 months of trial lessons, and be required to attend and observe lessons, group classes (held on Friday afternoons every other week), concerts and parent education sessions. An instrument could be borrowed during that time. Students of any level already enrolled in Pineland Suzuki School are also encouraged to apply.

Students should be listening daily to the recording of the Suzuki School Vol. 1 of their instrument. Parents come to the lessons, and learn to play also.

Pineland Suzuki School also offers scholarships for group classes.
